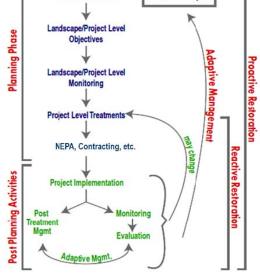
## Learn about conservation and restoration of the sagebrush biome!
